**Ash Wednesday → Lent → Holy week → Easter**

Ash Wednesday is just behind us. We received ashes on our foreheads with the words, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return." It's a sobering thing to do but also a freeing thing. It reminds us that we are mortal and yet God promises to hold us today and always. It reminds us that each and every day is precious and not to be taken for granted.

The Garden of Gethsemane, sleeping disciples and the betraying Judas.

Good Friday and the darkness and cries and the last breath.

Holy Saturday with the silence...

It is difficult but necessary and good for us to remember the events that happened. The things that took place. The lengths that Jesus chose to go through so that we all could know the love of God for us...always.

Holy Week is heavy but also essential for us to have a proper perspective on what Easter Sunday is all about.

Proper perspective...seeing things as they are, or more importantly, to see things as God sees them.

That is one of the main reasons why we continue to meet as people of God; to have perspective.

In this season of Lent, may you have perspective on how much God loves you.

May you grow in your faith and trust in that true promise from Jesus and the cross to you.

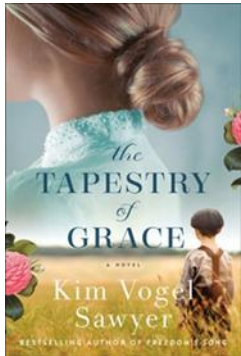
Holy Communion is a precious gift from God. Each time we receive it, God reminds us of the love and forgiveness we know through Jesus.

When a group of Kansas women start a *Frauenverein*, a benevolent society devoted to aiding widows and orphans, life changes for more than just the hurting people they seek to help. ***The Tapestry of Grace*** by Kim Vogel Sawyer is a heartwarming romance inspired by historical events.

With classes paused for the planting season, schoolteacher, Augusta Dyck, is glad for some meaningful work to occupy her time. She even knows exactly who their town's benevolent society should help first: quiet, reserved widower Konrad Rempel and his young twin sons. Konrad, however, is adamant that he doesn't want help. His boys are mischievous but good-hearted. And though Konrad may be struggling, he doesn't want anyone else to stick their nose in and tell him what his sons need. Or what he needs.

The charity's founder, Martina Krahn, is relieved to have a reason to spend time outside her unhappy home. It even occurs to her that she may, through her work, encounter a boy in need of a family and find a son for her husband since they have no children of their own. Augusta, Konrad, and Martina have needs and aspirations, and each imagines how these should be met: by reaching out or by being left alone.

- ✝  $\geq 40$  hours - students will also receive a graduation cord\*

\* it is the family's responsibility to see if the cord can be worn at the student's graduation ceremony at their high school

1. Get on the internet and go to our website at <https://peacelc.org/> (you can also simply type in [peacelc.org](https://peacelc.org/))

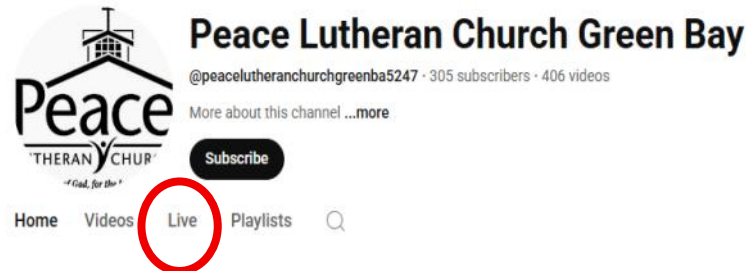
2. Scroll almost all the way down on that home page to see this →



- a. Click on the red button

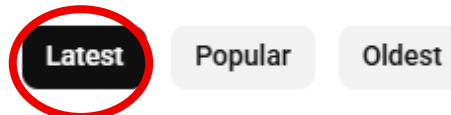
3. You should see this

- a. Click on the word Live



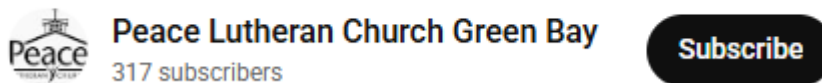
4. You should see this

- a. Click on the word Latest:



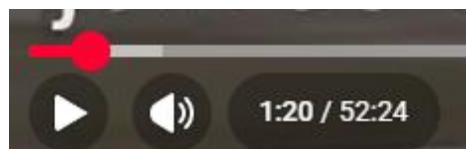
5. Underneath, something will pop up (maybe a picture, maybe words) – it is actually a video of that service! Click on that **and you should see the most recent church service**. The services usually start with the announcements. Underneath it, you will see something like this:

### **PLC-GB Worship, 11-30-25, Advent 1, Daniel 3, Hope**



- a. This tells you the date of the service you are watching, a title for it, and, under that, you will see how many others watched it via YouTube and how long ago it was put on there. **You do NOT need to subscribe.**

6. If you are **not** watching it live, you will have an option to forward through anything you want by moving the red ball underneath the video. First move your mouse over the video to see the red ball below it – see sample

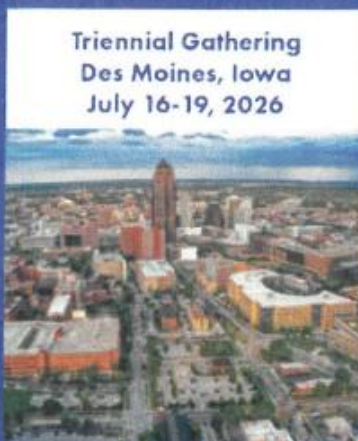
